THE SESSION

A considerable amount of good work was done by the Legislature in the Session which came to an end last week-Some of the measures adopted were of unusual importance in their special application to the exigencies of the times. Conspicuous among these was the legislation affecting the logging of spruce for aeroplanes. In the light of what is happening in France and Flanders it is impossible to conceive of any way in which the Government of this Province could have made a more effective contribution to the Allied arms. This action of the Provincial authorities may play a very essential part in determining the issue on the battlefront.

The measures affecting the P.G.E., the granting of bounties for iron and steel production, co-operation between the Province and the Dominion for the settlement of returned soldiers on the land, taxation, the minimum wage for women and the Civil Service are all of first importance in their relation to the economic and social development of the Province. 
