DISREGARD OF LIFE BY GERMAN COMMAND

London, May 1.—The Reuter correspondent at British headquarters in France, sends the following on the battle now under way:

"When Nogi reduced Port Arthur, we were told by military critics that it had been in terms of life which no Western general would have dared face. The German high command obviously ridicules the idea; it strews the slopes of Kemmel with German corpses as thick as Autumn leaves in Vallombrosa, and points triumphantly to the comparative handful of survivors who have reached the top.

"It is a simple problem of staying power. The enemy is taxing the British strength as heavily as he can, but in so doing he is taxing his own relatively even more heavily. He is fighting for positions which would give him greater advantage in the use of his numerical superiority. The question is whether if he eventually gained these positions, he would have any numerical superiority left. We now are fighting a war of exhaustion, in which the first principle is to weigh a mile lost against the thousands of enemy casualties paid for it.

"The general (Foch) is dealing with the situation with characteristic energy, although as to what counter moves he may contemplate there is no knowledge."

NEW VEIN EXPOSED AT SILVER STANDARD MINE AT HAZELTON

A little development work on No. 5 vein at the Silver Standard last week exposed a narrow seam of excellent ore—gray copper and zinc which developed into nearly all gray copper. It is some of the nicest ore yet found on the property.

All attention for the next few weeks will be devoted to the mill to keep it running to capacity as the ore storage is now filled. The work at the mine will be suspended until the mill catches up—Omineca Herald.

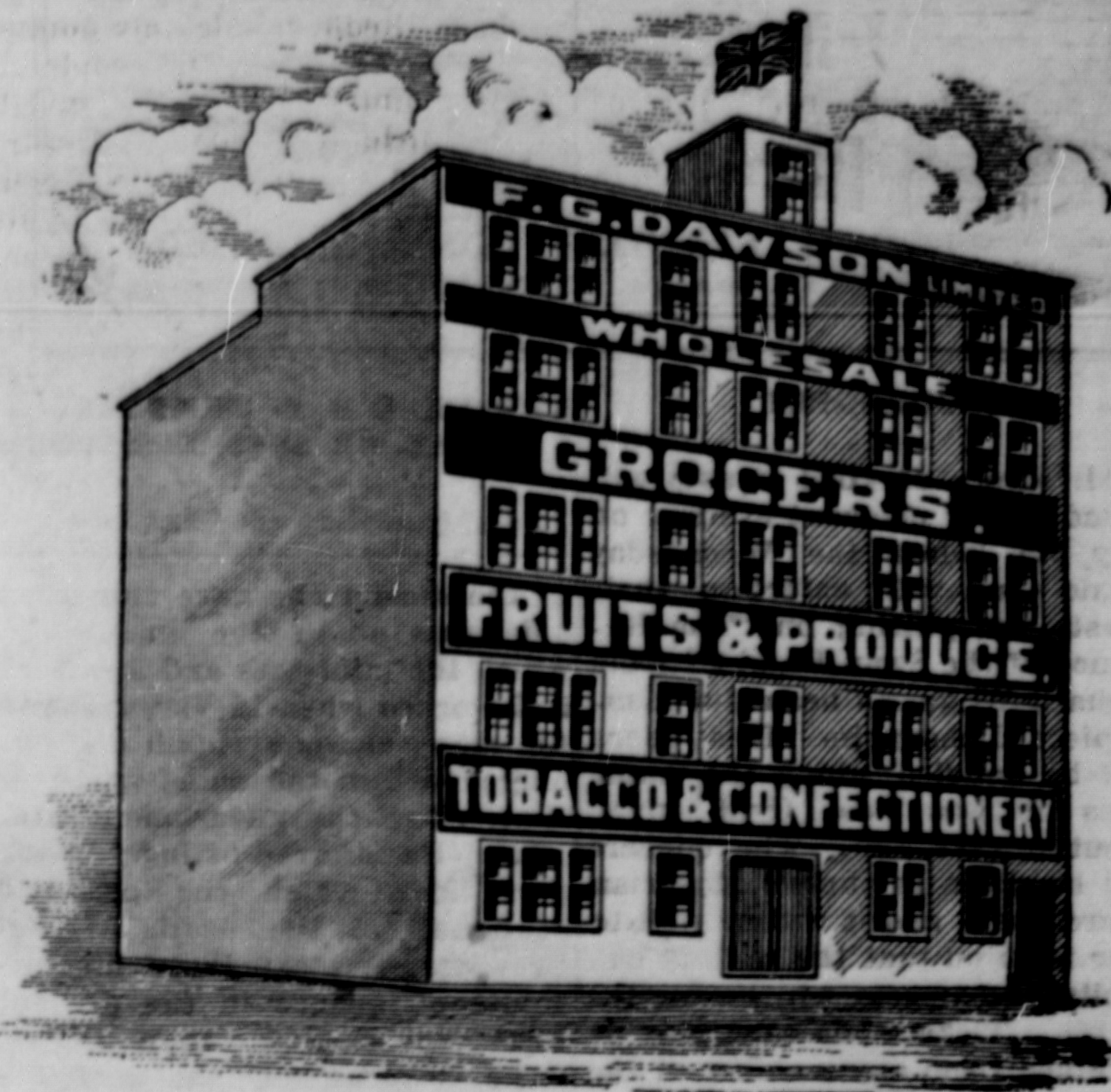
