SAYS GERMANS ARE GUILTY OF SACRILEGE

Washington, May 2 .- Cardinal Mercier, the Archbishop of Malines, Belgium, has issued to the clergy and adherents of his diocase a stirring circular letter of protest against the forcible seizure by the German authorities of Catholic Church property in Belgium. The Cardinal's letter, copies of which the Belgian Legation received today, is in part as follows:

"The painful tidings, announced semi-officially on February 8, by the occupying power, have been confirmed. The bulletin of laws and edicts dated February 21 requires an inventory of the bells and organs of our churches. Informed by experience, we need not delude ourselves; the inventory of today is the signal for the requisition of tomorrow.

"The repeated protests of the Soverein Pontiff, our appeal to the Chancellor of the Empire, appear thus to have been in vain. .

"In the execution of this duty of our pastoral office, we protest, dear brethren, against the injury which the forcible seizure of church property will cause to the liberty of our Holy Mother Church-

"We add that the removal of the bells, without the consent of the religious authorities, and despite their protests, will be a sacrilege.

"Yes, the seizure of our bells will be a profanation; whosoever assists in it will lend the hand to a sacrifege-


