## Local News Notes

Mrs. F. R. Alexander and Mrs. H. Phillips will have charge of the sale of home-cooking in the Red Cross hut on Friday afternoon.

The Rev. W. S. A. Larter and Mrs. Larter and daughter, who arrived in the city yesterday from the south, are the guests of Mr. and Mrs. Bazett-Jones, Emmerson Place.

Fishing arrivals today consist of the Nomad, 10,000 lbs.; Lincoln 7,000; Lief E., 11,000; Royal, 4,000; Cayzeon, 5,000, and Sadie, 4,000 lbs. No sales were made up till noon.

Mr. and Mrs. A. Haines have returned to their home on Fifth Ave., E., after their visit east. Accompanying them on a short visit are Mr. and Mrs. A. S. Redditt, of Toronto, father and mother of Mrs. Haines. They will visit here for a week or two before returning home to Toronto.

There is no change in the situation with regard to the strike of the fish packers at the Cold Storage plant today. The men want an advance from 50c per hour to 62½¢ with an eight-hour instead of a nine-hour day. The company offers 60c to take effect from the 1st of May. Meantime, the men are still out and the company's plant is tied up.

Private Arthur Davey, of a Yorkshire regiment, was home in England some few months ago from France, when he received the decoration of the Military Cross. Word has just been received by Mr. John E. Davey, of this city, his brother, that since the beginning of the German drive on March 21, he has been missing. He has disappeared, and is either killed or prisoner.

Mr. S. C. Hayden, of Ottawa, who has been engaged here on the coast for the past several seasons in connection with the geodetic survey, arrived again in the city yesterday to resume the work for this season. This is for establishing properly the correct position of many places along the coast with regard to latitude and longitude, which, according to the present charts, are not quite correct.

## KRUPPS HAVE HOPES OF DEVELOPING THE RUSSIAN IRONFIELDS

Pekin, May 7.—Reports have been received through Tokio from Siberia which state that the Maximalists, with German aid, intend to break up the railway which runs along the shores of Lake Baikal should the Japanese advance project mature. Simultaneously a portion of Krupps' plant will be moved to the Ural district, while stores from Archangel will be despatched to Siberia via the Arctic and the Yenisei River. This shows that the Germanization of Siberia has been long planned.
