WHAT BRITISH SUBS. HAVE BEEN DOING

Washington, May 11.—More than forty German warships have been attacked successfully by British submarines.

This was disclosed by an official British statement received here and made public today by the Committee on Public Information. The review was the most extensive ever received in this country of the work of the British underwater craft, concerning the activities of which little news has reached America since their famous raids in the Dardanelles and the Baltic Sea.

Various exploits of individual craft are recounted. In many instances the submarine commanders have threaded their way through dangerous mine fields to seek out their quarry, and so successful have they been in penetrating the defenses of the German coast that the report notes that the enemy "rarely allows his above-water craft beyond the confines of his harbors."

FAR-REACHING RULING OF POLICE MAGISTRATE WILL AFFECT MANY MEN

Winnipeg, May 11.—Sir Hugh John Macdonald, the police magistrate, has ordered the wholesale arrest of men engaged in various employments under the Anti-Loafing Act. Men doing work which can equally well be done by women, Sir Hugh, in effect, has ruled, are not engaged in useful occupation. The judgment affects men employed in conducting confectionery stores or clerking in grocery stores and the same principle extends to dozens of similar activities.

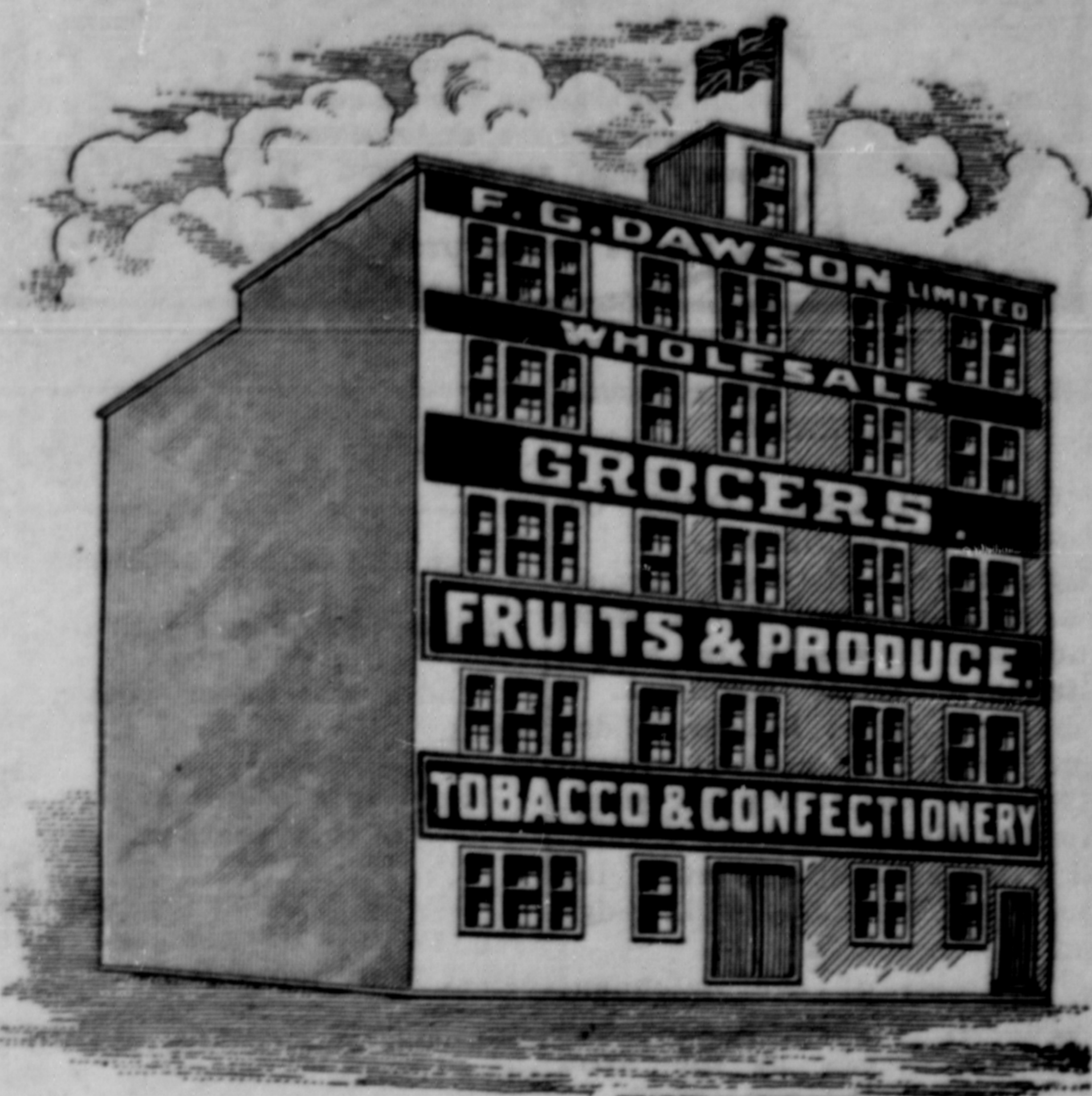
