

# Pilot C. MARNENT BLOGS. 42 One Of Victims U. Aerial Tragedy In Northwest

He and Horace Tory and Harry King Lost Lives Five Days Ago When Their Machine Was Wrecked Near Mazenod Lake-Poor Visibility Blamed

EDMONTON, July 5:-Pilot Andy Cruickshank, aged 33, Horace Tory, 35, chief mechanic of the Canadian Airways Limited staff north of Fort McMurray, and Harry King, aged 32, mechanic, were killed when their airplane crashed near Mazenod Lake, eighty miles north of Fort Rae, in the Northwest Territories about five days ago. "bodies and the wrecked machine! were found late Monday by Pilot Walter E. Gilbert, one of the airmen who have been searching for them. Poor visibility is blamed for the tragedy.
