TO DRIVE HUNS BACK

"The German aggressive will be stopped when the Allied aggressive begins," is the ponderous conclusion arrived at by the Vancouver Province. That this Allied aggression may start any day is a foregone conclusion. The two newspapers of Paris having the largest circulation, Le Matin and the Petit Parisien, both on Monday predicted an early offensive movement on the part of the Allies. They express the conviction that Generals Foch and Petain. who proved themselves good offensive men in subordinate commands, and notably so at the battle of the Marne, when the Hun was within twenty-five miles of Paris, will display the same qualities now that they are in high command.

General Foch, now in supreme command of the Allied forces, may conclude that it is easier to concentrate for attack than for defence. Undoubtedly the German lines have assailable points. There are men and guns, tanks and gas available for a new offensive. Such an attack may find German lines that are "thinly held." It will discover that Germans are taking their turn in "withdrawing to lines already prepared."
