A day will come when the only battlefield will be the market open to commerce, and the mind opening to new ideas. A day will come when bullets and bombshells will be replaced by votes, by the universal suffrage of nations, by arbitration of a sovereign senate, which will be to Europe what the parliament is to England, the diet of Germany, the legislative essembly to France. A day will come when a cannonball will be exhibited in public museums, just as an instrument of torture is now, and the people will be astonished how such a thing could have been. A day will come when these two immense groups, the United States of America and the United States of Europe, shall be seen extending the hand of followship across the ocean, exchanging their products, their industry, improving creation under the eye of the creator, and uniting for the good of all these two irresistible and infinite powers-the fraternity of men and the power of God-Victor Hugo.

### PREDICTS DOOM OF KAISER

London, June 6 .- "I Believe this war will have been fought in vain if at its conclusion the Kaiser and his war lords do not find their heads in a noose," said John Hodge, Minister of Pensions and a Labor Party leader, in an address today.

'An inconclusive peace would be a greater disaster than continuance of the war. No matter what the sacrifice, we have got to fight to the finish."
