WAR CONFERENCE

All the representatives from the various British dominions have now arrived in London for the Imperial conference, which is likely to begin its sessions today or tomorrow. The conference about to meet will be more representative than any former meeting of the kind, representing more political parties and therefore a greater variety of political opinion. The Imperial delegates are both Liberal and Conservative. Two Conservatives and two Liberal Unionists are present to represent Canada. Australia has sent her premier, who was head of the Labor government before the coalition, and with him the man who was formerly Liberal leader. New Zealand contributes a member of each party to her coalition. Native representatives of India will appear with the head of the India office, which will be a new and startling feature of such gatherings.

War problems of great urgency will occupy the conference and these include the more economic use of the Empire's shipping, the speeding up of shipbuilding, which daily becomes increasingly the key of the Allied position, and the more effective distribution of the Empire's food and metal resources. Another matter will be the more direct participation by the overseas dominions in the administration of the service-

Among other war problems for consideration, two dominate all others. First is the question of the German colonies overlooking Australia, New Zealand and South Africa. Ministers from the southern dominions, notably Premier Hughes and Premier Botha.


