"There are only three seasons here," remarked an old sourdough from way down south, "winter, summer and the Fourth of July."

So all old Dawsonites now in Rupert will recall with pleasant memories how, at this hour, they were planning for the great outing and ceremony of the Yukon year. Planning to take all the children and climb the mountain immediately back of Dawson, there on the summit as midnight struck to hear a "sermon on the Mount," to feast, to dance, to sing in one huge chorus that mingled with the music of the spheres.

Then a sudden hush, the faces of all the merry-makers turned to a point in the west like sun worshippers. The great red orb sinks lower and lower behind the distant mountains, with him the daylight departs. The crowd is tensely, breathlessly watching, waiting. But for a few moments only, and a new sun pops up at nearly the same place as the old one died away—a new sun with a face like that of a boy prepared by fond mother for school. All the brass bands roar out and gay shouts greet the finale of the miracle—the death of a day; the birth of a new day.

### LAND REGISTRY ACT.

(Sections 26 and 134.)

### SYNOPSIS OF LAND ACT AMENDMENT

Pre-emption now confined to surveyed lands only.  
Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes and which is non-timber land.  
Partnership pre-emption abolished, but parties of not more than four may arrange for adjacent pre-emption, with joint residence, but each making necessary improvements on respective claims.  
Pre-emptors must occupy improvements for value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivation of at least 2 acres, before receiving Crown Grant.  
Where pre-emptor in occupation not suitable for agricultural purposes, he may, because of ill-health or other cause, be granted intermediate certificate of improvement and transfer his claim.  
Records without permanent residence may be issued provided applicant makes improvements to extent of \$500 per annum and records same each year. Failure to make improvements or record same will operate as forfeiture. Title cannot be obtained on these claims in less than 5 years, with improvements of \$10 per acre, including 5 acres cleared and cultivated, and residence of at least 2 years.  
Pre-emptor holding Crown Grant may record another pre-emption, if he requires land in conjunction with his farm, without actual occupation, provided statutory improvements made and residence maintained on Crown granted land.

Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20 acres, may be leased as homesteads; title to be obtained after fulfilling residential and improvement conditions.  
For grazing and industrial purposes, areas exceeding 40 acres may be leased by one person or company.  
**PRE-EMPTORS' FREE GRANTS ACT.**  
The scope of this Act is enlarged to include all persons joining and serving with His Majesty's Forces. The time within which the heirs or devisees of a deceased pre-emptor may apply for title under this Act is extended from one year from the death of such person, as formerly, until one year after the conclusion of the present war. This privilege is also made retroactive.  
**TOWNSITE PROPERTY ALLOTMENT ACT.**  
Provision is made for the grant to persons holding unimproved Agreements to Purchase from the Crown of such proportion of the land, if divisible, as the payments already made will cover in proportion to the sale price of the whole parcel. Two or more persons holding such Agreements may group their interests and apply for a proportionate allotment jointly, if considered advisable to divide the land covered by an application for a proportionate allotment, an allotment of equal value selected from available Crown lands in the locality may be made. These allotments are conditional upon payment of all taxes due the Crown or to any municipality. The rights of persons to whom the purchase from the Crown has agreed to sell are also protected. The decision of the Minister of Lands in respect to the adjustment of a proportionate allotment is final. The time for making application for these allotments is limited to the 1st day of May, 1919. Any application made after that date will not be considered. These allotments apply to town lots and lands of the Crown sold at public auction.

### Every Woman

On June 22nd, every woman of sixteen years and over must attend at one of the places provided for registration between the hours of 7 a.m. and 10 p.m. and there truthfully answer all questions set forth upon the registration card. Failure to register means heavy penalties—as Registration is law.

### Volunteer Workers Needed

The registering of 5,000,000 people in one day is a stupendous task, and voluntary helpers are urgently needed. Individuals, women's societies, clubs, fraternal societies, church organizations and municipal organizations are asked to help. The Board appeals with confidence to the patriotism of every Canadian woman and to the pride which every locality must take in doing its own work well, to furnish the necessary number of volunteer deputies and assistants. Those willing to offer their services should apply to the Registrar in their district.
