CANADIANS TILL ENGLAND'S SOIL

Ottawa, June 15.—While preparing for their entry into the area of bayonets and hand grenades in Flanders, Canadian soldiers in England are fighting the Germans with spade and plow. The militia department has received a statement from the overseas authorities dealing with the efforts of the Canadian troops to aid in the great campaign for increased food production in the British Isles.

This statement estimates that there are 874 acres now under cultivation by the Canadian forces in England, seventy-two of which are being tilled by the hospitals, which produce vegetables, flowering plants, etc., for the benefit of the troops.

The scheme provides that each unit should run its own farm. They are given permission to draw working capital from their regimental canteen funds; if there are no funds, money is advanced them by the authorities in London. There is no expense to the Canadian public, as these advances are all repaid when the crop is sold.

The main crops, such as potatoes, carrots, etc., are sold to the Army and Navy Canteen Board, which, in turn, resells them to the quartermaster-generals' department for issue to the troops. The profits go to the agricultural fund of the unit for future operations or to the regimental canteen fund to be expended on the men.

In connection with their agricultural activities, the Canadians are setting out shade trees along the roads. Future generations of English people will point to those trees as relics of the time when the Canadians came over to do their bit for the salvation of the world. The men take a keen interest in the work.

During the stay of His Majesty the King at the royal pavilion, Aldershot, vegetables were supplied to the royal table from the area cultivated by the soldiers in the finest quality and His Majesty expressed his appreciation in a letter of thanks to Gen. Meighen.

In default of a covenant or condition of his power being given before registration as owner of the person entitled under such tax sale, all persons so served with notice, and those claiming through or under them, and all persons claiming any interest in the land by virtue of any unregistered instrument, and all persons claiming any interest in the land under a registered title, and registered under the provisions of this Act, shall be ever estopped and barred from setting up any claim to or in respect of the land so sold for taxes, and the Registrar shall register the person entitled under such tax sale as owner of the land so sold for taxes."

AND WHEREAS application has been made for a Certificate of Indefeasible Title to the above-mentioned lands, in the name of John E. Berg.

AND WHEREAS on investigating the title it appears that prior to the 13th day of October, 1916 (the date on which the said lands were sold for overdue taxes), you were the assessed owner thereof.

FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that it is the same time I shall effect registration in pursuance of such application and issue a Certificate of Indefeasible Title to the said lands in the name of John E. Berg, unless you take and prosecute the proper proceedings to establish your claim, if any, to the said lands, or to prevent such proposed action on my part.



SYNOPSIS OF LAND ACT AMENDMENT

Pre-emption now confined to surveyed lands only.

Records will be granted covering only lands suitable for agriculture purposes and which is not timber land.

Partnership pre-emptions abolished, but parties of not more than four may arrange for adjacent pre-emptions, with joint residence, but each making separate improvements on resulting claims.

Pre-emptors must occupy claims for five years and make improvements to value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivation of at least 5 acres before receiving Crown Grant.

Where a pre-emptor in occupation not less than 2 years, and has made proportionate improvements, he may, because of ill-health or other cause, be granted intermediate certificate of improvement and transfer to another.

Records will be issued provided applicant makes improvements to extent of \$300 per annum and records same each year.

Failure to make improvements or record same will operate as forfeiture.

Title cannot be obtained on these claims in less than 5 years, with improvements of \$30 per acre, including 5 acres cleared and cultivated, and residence of at least 5 years.

Pre-emptor holding Crown Grant may record another pre-emption if he requires land in conjunction with his farm, without actual occupation, provided statutory improvements made and residence maintained on Crown granted land.

Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20 acres, may be leased as homesteads, subject to payment of full proportionate rental and improvement conditions.

For grazing and industrial purposes, areas exceeding 60 acres may be leased by one person or company.
