MIGHT MAKES RIGHT?

"An election is only an election if the voters exercise their right of judgment freely and with knowledge of facts and conditions as they are, and if the votes, after being cast, are counted as they were cast." In this way the Edmonton Evening Bulletin begins an article on The Soldier Vote, a subject which is of the deepest interest to the people of this paarliamentary riding. The article quotes from the statements of Messrs. Copp and Archambault in the House of Commons at Ottawa, which establish the fact that, so far as the soldier vote in Canada and England was concerned, there was no election on December 17th. These statements were in detail, and gave the fullest and most intimate particulars in regard to many thousands of votes and voters; so that until they are disproved they must stand as established facts. Messrs. Copp and Archambault spoke in parliament on their responsibility as members; their statements are officially recorded. If these statements were untrue in any particular, that untruth was capable of absolute demonstration then and there, without difficulty and without delay. The only reply of the Government, or of those who spoke for the Government, was that it did not matter how the soldiers' votes were cast. as the Government was in power with the support of a majority of the civilian vote. This, it may be presumed, was the best answer the Government was able to make, and the statements of Messrs. Copp and Archambault were not denied or disproven, but stand as unchallenged facts, as the privilege of proving their charges before a judicial tribunal was denied them. The parliamentary following of the government of course voted against the request. That was to be expected. But that the highminded patriots composing the Unionist party would stoop to such political trickery was not




