TAKE NOTICE that George H. Boulton, as agent for Masset Inlet Lumber Co., Ltd., Graham Island Spruce and Cedar Co., Ltd., and Aeroplan Spruce and Cedar Lumber Co., Ltd., whose address is Port Clements, B.C., will apply for a license to take and use 30,000 gallons and to store one-ninth acre feet of water out of Coho Creek, which flows northerly, and drains into the Yakoun River, Masset Inlet. The storage dam will be located at about 600 yards from the mouth of said creek. The capacity of the reservoir to be created is about one-ninth acre feet and it will flood about 0.20 acres of land. The water will be diverted from the stream at a point near the dam, and will be used for domestic and steam purposes upon the land described as Lot 746, Block 25. This notice was posted on the ground on the 20th day of May, 1918. A copy of this notice and an application pursuant thereto and to the "Water Act, 1914," will be filed at the office of the Water Recorder at Prince Rupert, B.C. 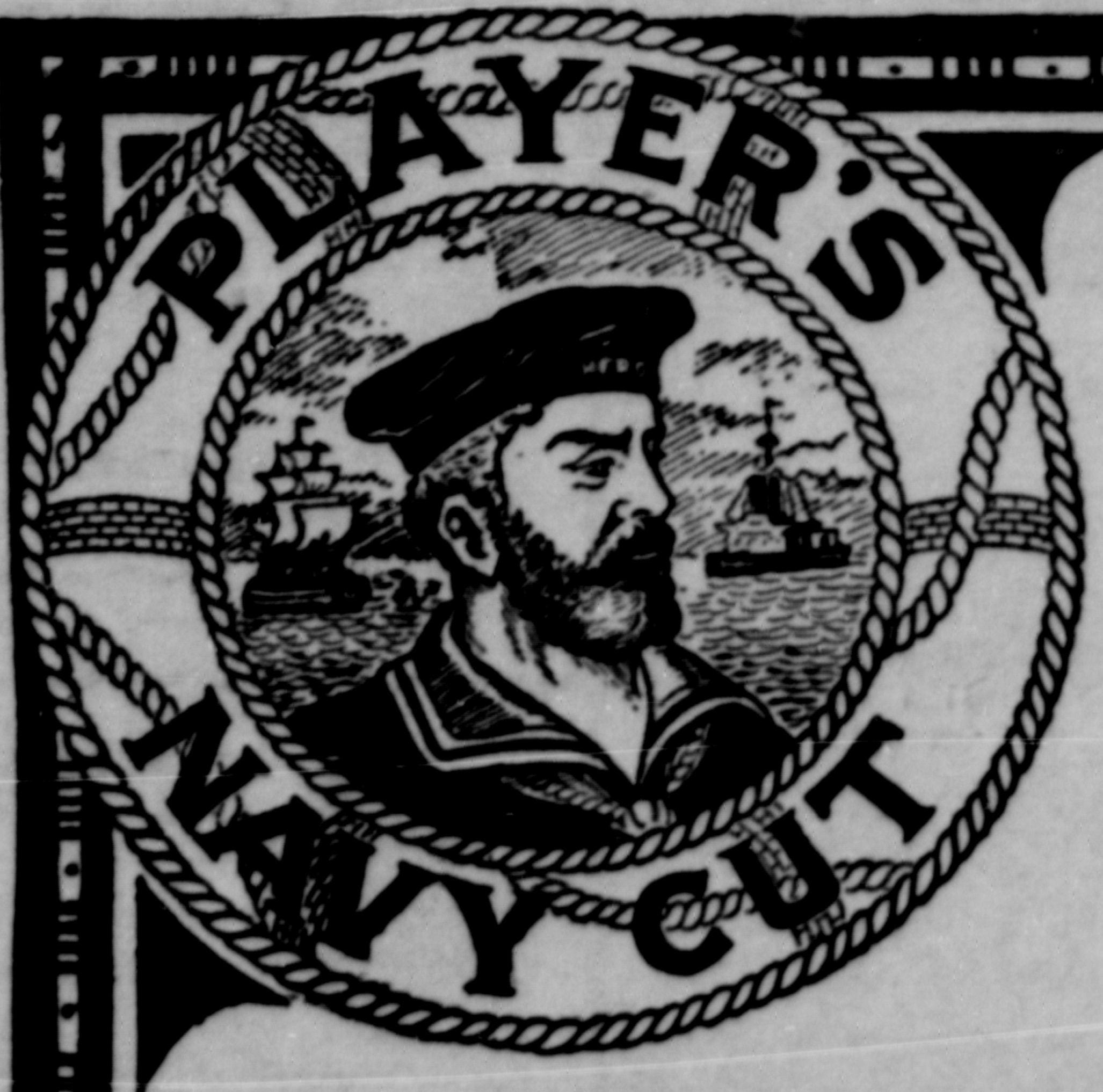
