

#### THE PLAIN PEOPLE

The manner in which nearly all over the country the challenge thrown to the Canadian people by the Borden Government practically appointing their own candidates in every constituency, is being taken up is significant. In every constituency in Ontario, even in the Conservative strongholds. Labor and Liberal candidates are opposing the nominees of the Borden Government. The plain people have come to see through the manner in which the Borden Government and all that it stands for, sought to blindfold the electorate. Unionism is a fine thing, just before election time. But when Union Government would have been best for Canada, which was at the beginning of the war, nothing was ever heard of it. The Borden Government were then too busy with other things to bother with Union Government. But at the last moment, when they began to find out that there were extremely good chances of the Canadian voters turning them down flat as Conservatives-six years' experience of them being quite enough-then Sir Robert Borden and his colleagues bethought themselves that a rose by any other name would smell as sweet, and that under the guise of a Union Government. the Tory party would be able to continue on as heretofore.

The Canadian people, however, being able to see through a brick wall as far as most people, have come to the conclusion that there is but little difference other than in name. between the late Conservative party and those who are now making such a noise about Union Government. The important "win-the-war Conservatives are out strong for Union Government, or rather to be more particular, the Borden Government. Any other kind of Union Government will not do. Sir Robert Borden and Sir Thomas White are to retain their positions as premier and minister of finance in this new Borden Union Government.

The chiefest advocates of this new religion, Union Government under Sir Robert Borden, are the members of the late Conservative party. It is the same here in Prince Rupert, as in other parts of the country. The old Tory is the loyalist, who can afford to term all those who do not see eye to eye with him, as "traitors." Whoever does not cast their thoughts in the Conservative manner is disloyal to their country, and if the good old! Tories could do so, they would take their votes away.


