SUCCESS AT LAUSANNE

The report that came from Lausanne yesterday to the effect that a settlement of the reparations problem had been reached and that Germany and France had got together in a final agreement which would prove beneficial to the world, was the best news received in many a day. It will prove a great feather in the cap of Premier Ramsay MacDonald of England who has been leading the negotiation on behalf of the British government.

It is to be hoped and expected that this settlement will be the first important step toward the return of better times and that it will also tend to draw the countries of

Europe closer together. Britain has already started on the road to financial recovery and with the other European countries in agreement over reparations, there should be an almost instant improvement in Germany, Austria, France, Italy and Belgium. This improvement will reflect itself in other countries and will tend to give the world confidence in the future and prevent drastic political moves such as might otherwise have been expected. With a return to a greater degree of prosperity people will forget many of their's grievances and the wheels of administration will turn

NEXT BIG MOVE

The next big move will probably take place at Ottawa when representatives of the nations of the Empire will sit around a table and discuss the economics of the commonwealth. Such matters as inter-imperial tariffs and preferences will be among the subjects settlement of which may have a great effect on the markets for Canadian wheat, lumber, minerals and fish, in all of which Prince Rupert is directly interested.

The success at Lausanne has raised the hopes of Imperial Rates and Household Inventories statesmen that Ottawa may also have a successful conference and one that more nearly affects the Dominion of Canada and her future.
