The foudation for the moral training emphasised by Judge Young must of necessity be laid in the home, while the technical training spoken of by Principal Brady is more a matter for the community. Regarding the matter of technical training, there can be no doubt that Canada, in common with other new countries, has a long way to go. There was no great necessity for the provision of facilities in this direction when the population was small and scattered, and the demand for technical men non existent.
