NO FAILURE.

Under the ordeal of the great German attack, dispatches from the British Headquarters state that not a single battalion "failed or faltered," and responsible quarters are gratified at the manner in which the British troops have withstood the heaviest attack which the enemy has made since the war began. It is noteworthy that some of the actual retirements on our front have been made only upon receipt of definite orders, after the troops had held their positions, bearing the brunt of the assault.

The defence which has been put up by the British and their French allies so far, most assuredly constitutes one of the greatest epics in history. They have taken such toll of the enemy that the wake of his advance has been likened to a vast hetacomb. When it is remembered that the enemy concentration of guns, and of men is the greatest ever seen on so small a front, and that every mile he gains makes just another mile over which he has to bring up supplies, and food and reinforcements, his difficulties must increase the further he goes west. A great proportion of the strength of the enemy has already been expended during this first week of constant attacking, and the momentum of his initial progress must soon wear Itself out. It is questionable whether the German forces can bear any continuation of the physical losses which he has sustained already, and successfully main-


