Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes Partnership pre-emptions abolished, but parties of not more than four may five years and make improvements to value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivation of at least 5 acres, before receiving Crown Grant. emptor in occupation not less than 3 years, and has made propor-
