BIG SALMON PACK AT ALASKAN POINTS

Estimated That Something Like 800,000 Cases Had been Put Up By August 1st.

A collation of the figures of the pack of a part of the canneries of the Northern Division of South-eastern Alaska indicates that the total canned salmon pack of the district on August 1 approximated 800,000 cases, and the best part of the season is still ahead. This is an improvement over the record pack of last year.

The following is the record as far as could be gathered and it is the nearest complete list thus far published:

- Excursion Inlet, Astoria and Puget Sound Company, 40,000 cases; Todd Packing Company, 9,000; Hood Bay, Hidden Inlet Company, 20,000; Chatham, 51,000; Pyramid Packing Company, Sitka, 12,000; Tenakee Fisheries Company, 32,000; Hoonah Packing Company, 90,000; Anuk Bay, 18,000; Taku Harbor, 70,000; Hawk Inlet, 87,000; Port Althorp, 52,000; Petersburg, 52,000; Seow Bay, 10,000; Tee Harbor, 26,000; Gambier Bay, 62,000; Juneau and Douglas canneries about 10,000.

The totals of these canneries is 624,000 cases.

The Funter Bay cannery of the Thlinget Packing Company, one of the always successful four-line canneries, should add 90,000 to this total, and the Lynn Canal, Pillar Bay, Red Bluff Bay, Idaho Inlet, and other canneries not included in the list should bring the grand total well above the 800,000 mark.
