A LUMBER MILL IS BEING MOVED NORTH TO CUMSHEWA INLET

Shearwater Lumber Company to Cut Spruce for the Imperial Munitions Board During Winter.

The Shearwater Lumber Company is moving its plant up from the Fraser river to Cumshewa where it will be put in running order at once and will be ready to cut logs during the late autumn. This with the two mills which are being erected at Thurston Harbor and the renovated Queen Charlotte City mill, will make the four mills that are to operate on Moresby Island during the coming winter.

Mr. McMillan who is in charge of the work of the Munitions Board in this part of the country and who arrived in the city yesterday from Thurston Harbor, said that the work of erecting the new mills there was well under way and within sixty days he hoped to have the first in operation. That will mean that they will be able to cut lumber during the winter when it is difficult to tow the Davis rafts across. The lumber will then be shipped here in the ocean-going barges which have been secured for the purpose and will prevent the supply of aeroplane spruce being cut off during any season of the year.

MINISTER OF LANDS ON LUMBER TRADE

Hon. T. D. Pattullo Writes Article Which Gives Interesting Facts Regarding Output.

Hon. T. D. Pattullo, minister of Lands, has been investigating the B. C. lumber business and gives his conclusions in the course of an article published in the Canada Lumberman and Woodworker. His article is optimistic and he gives some interesting statistics. He points out that in 1917, despite a lack of shipping, cars and labor, there was an increase on production of 367,012,000 feet board measurement.

Citing other hopeful signs Mr. Pattullo proceeds: "While the export of water-borne lumber to the United Kingdom shows a not unnatural decrease of 6,000,000 feet and to South Africa a decrease of 5,000,000 feet, yet our export to Australia shows an increase of 14,000,000 feet, and the total export, as compared with 1916, shows a slight advance in favor of 1917. Again, carrying on the comparison, the 'cut' values have increased about one-third, which is commensurate with the increased production of lumber; the value of the 1917 forest crop being \$48,300,000, while the figures for 1916 were \$35,528,000. This record of a year of great stress, of a year when the demands of the army upon an already considerably depleted civil population has made great inroads into the available labor supply, is a year to which we in British Columbia can justly point with pride.

"An important feature of the lumber industry is that of the pulp and paper mills," he suggests. "Not only have all plants been running to full capacity, but new ones are being erected. The enquiries received as to the pulp possibilities in British Columbia show that, so far as the province is concerned, this industry is but in its infancy. The decrease in the year's production of sulphite pulp brings the remarkable figures of 300 per cent. to light; the production for 1917 being 43,644 tons, against 14,389 tons for 1916. Newsprint also shows an appreciable increase, the output for 1917 being 75,833 tons, and for the previous year 65,229, while the 'wrapper' production was 3,170 tons. These figures justify the hope expressed in 1916, that 1917 would show a doubled production."

SYNOPSIS OF LAND ACT AMENDMENT

Pre-emption now confined to surveyed lands only.
 Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes and which is non-timber land.
 Carriership pre-emptions abolished, but parties of not more than four may arrange for adjacent pre-emptions, with joint residence, but each making necessary improvements on respective claims.
 Pre-emptors must occupy claims for five years and make improvements to value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivation of at least 5 acres, before receiving Crown Grant.
 Where 1-2-acre in occupation not less than 3 years, and has made proportionate improvements, he may, because of ill-health or other cause, be granted intermediate certificate of improvement and transfer his claim.
 Records without permanent residence may be issued provided applicant makes improvements to extent of \$500 per annum and records same each year. Failure to make improvements or record same will operate as forfeiture. Title cannot be obtained on these claims in less than 5 years, with improvements of \$10 per acre, including 5 acres cleared and cultivated, and residence of at least 2 years.

Pre-emptor holding Crown Grant may record another pre-emption, if he requires land in conjunction with his farm, without actual occupation, provided statutory improvements made and residence maintained on Crown granted land.
 Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20 acres, may be leased as homesteads; title to be obtained after fulfilling residential and improvement conditions.
 Grazing and industrial purposes, areas exceeding 640 acres may be leased by one person or company.

PRE-EMPTORS' FREE GRANTS ACT.
 The scope of this Act is enlarged to include all persons joining and serving with His Majesty's Forces. The time within which the heirs or devisees of a deceased pre-emptor may apply for title under this Act is extended from one year from the death of such person, as formerly, until one year after the conclusion of the present war. This privilege is also made retroactive.

TOWNSITE PROPERTY ALLOTMENT ACT.

Provision is made for the grant to persons holding uncompleted Agreements to Purchase from the Crown of such proportion of the land, if divisible, as the payments already made will cover in proportion to the sale price of the whole parcel. Two or more persons holding such Agreements may group their interests and apply for a proportionate allotment jointly. If it is not considered advisable to divide the land covered by an application for a proportionate allotment, an allotment of land of equal value selected from available Crown lands in the locality may be made. These allotments are conditional upon payment of all taxes due the Crown or to any municipality. The rights of persons to whom the purchaser from the Crown has agreed to sell are also protected. The decision of the Minister of Lands in respect to the adjustment of a proportionate allotment is final after this date will not be considered. These allotments apply to town lots and lands of the Crown sold at public auction.
