Citing other hopeful signs Mr. Pattullo proceeds: "While the export of water-borne lumber to the United Kingdom shows a not unnatural decrease of 6,000,000 feet and to South Africa a decrease of 5,000,000 feet, yet our evport to Australia shows an increase of 14,000,000 feet, and the total export, as compared with 1916, shows a slight advance in favor of 1917. Again, carrying on the comparison, the 'cut' values have increased about one-third, which is commensurate with the increased production of lumber; the value of the 1917 forest crop being \$48,300,000, while the figures for 1916 were \$35,528,000. This record of a year of great stress, of a year when the demands of the army upon an already considerably depleted civil with pride.

"An important feature of the pulp and paper mills," he suggests. "Not only have all plants new ones are being erected. SYNOPSIS OF LAND ACT AMENDMENT

Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes Partnership pre-emptions abolished, but parties of not more than four may arrange for adjacent pre-emptions, with joint residence, but each making neces-Pre-emptors must occupy claims for five years and make improvements to value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivation of at least 5 acres, be-

fore receiving Crown Grant. Where 1 3-emptor in occupation not less than 3 years, and has made proportionate improvements, he may, because Intermediate certificate of improvement

Records without permanent residence may be issued provided applicant makes improvements to extent of \$300 per an-\$10 per acre, including 5 acres cleared and cultivated, and residence of

Pre-emptor holding Crown Grant may record another pre-emption, if he reland in conjunction with his farm, without actual occupation, provided statutory improvements made and residence maintained on Crown granted

Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20 acres, may be leased as homesites; title to be obtained after fulfilling residential and improvement conditions. For grazing and industrial purposes, areas exceeding 640 acres may be leased by one person or company.

PRE-EMPTORS' FREE GRANTS ACT. The scope of this Act is enlarged to include all persons joining and serving with His Majesty's Forces. The time deceased pre-emptor may apply for title under this Act is extended from one year from the death of such person, as formerly, until one year after the conclusion of the present war. This privilege is also made retroactive. TOWNSITE PROPERTY ALLOTMENT

Provision is made for the grant to persons holding uncompleted Agreements to Purchase from the Crown of cuch proportion of the land, if divisible, as the payments already made will cover in proportion to the sale price of the whole parcel. Two or more persons holding such Agreements may group their interests and apply for a proporconsidered advisable to divide the land tionate allotment, an allotment of land of equal value selected from available Crown lands in the locality may be made. These allotments are conditional upon payment of all taxes due the Crown or to any municipality.
