INDIAN MISSION ON NAAS BEING MOVED

Mrs. McCullagh Tells of District in Which She Lives; Young Men Have Gone to The War.

Among recent visitors to the city was Mrs. McCullagh, wife of Rev. J. B. McCullagh of the Church Missionary Society stationed at the Naas. She was visiting a number of friends while in the city and returned to her home on Monday.

Speaking of the Naas to a News man, Mrs. McCullagh said that the scenery there was wonderful. Nothing that she had seen equalled it. The only objection to the country was that so few people lived there that it was rather lonely. Most of the young men who formerly were there had gone to the front and the families moved away.

The floods of last year which were likely to recur had made it necessary for the Indians to move a couple of miles up the river from Aiyansh to Gittlakdamix. They were building a log house there first and the mission would be moved during the winter.

FOUR HUNDRED MILES THROUGH GAME HAUNTS

George M. Beirnes Returns After Taking 25 Horses Over Trail From Hazelton to Telegraph Creek.

After driving 25 horses along a four-hundred-mile woodland trail, swimming several rivers, feeding on caribou meat killed by himself and seeing an immense number of bear, moose, caribou and deer on the trail, G. M. Beirnes arrived in the city yesterday and went on to his home in Hazelton.

Mr. Beirnes is an experienced woodsman and he has often made the trip through from Hazelton to Telegraph Creek on the Stikine before. He takes in a bunch of horses every year and he always sees lots of game en route. Now he is planning to take in hunting parties himself by way of Hazelton, and there is no reason why he should not do so. He says that Hazelton is just as near the bighorn and caribou and moose and grizzly bear as is Telegraph Creek and it should just as well be the centre for big game hunting. This would be a great benefit to Hazelton and also would benefit Prince Rupert.

The long trip across to the Stikine was commenced on August 2 and 21 days were taken in crossing. Meat running short, a caribou was shot, but there was not a day when big game was not seen, all sorts of big fellows, especially moose and caribou.

At Telegraph Creek were two movie picture outfits which were there to photograph the big game in their haunts. A picture of them was taken swimming across the Skeena, at the place where the bridge has been washed away.

The best of the big game hunting is about 150 miles from Hazelton. There is more or less game, especially bear, all the way, but the bighorn are some distance away. The roads are good, for the provincial government has put in a number of bridges and repaired the trail, thus making it easy to reach the hunting ground. The trail passes through the famous Groundhog coal fields but no work is being done there just now.

WATER NOTICE USE AND STORAGE.

SYNOPSIS OF LAND ACT AMENDMENT

Pre-emption now confined to surveyed lands only. Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes and which are non-timber land. Partnership pre-emption abolished, but parties of not more than four may arrange for adjacent pre-emption, with joint residence, but each making necessary improvements on respective claims. Pre-emptors must occupy claims for five years and make improvements to value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivation of at least 5 acres, before receiving Crown Grant.

Where a pre-emptor in occupation not less than 5 years, and has made proportionate improvements, he may, because of ill-health or other cause, be granted intermediate certificate of improvement and transfer his claim.

Records without permanent residence improvements to extent of \$300 per annum and records same each year. Failure to make improvements or record same will operate as forfeiture. Title cannot be obtained on these claims in less than 5 years, with improvements of \$10 per acre, including 5 acres cleared and cultivated, and residence of at least 2 years.

Pre-emptor holding Crown Grant may record another pre-emption, if he requires land in conjunction with his farm, without actual occupation, provided statutory improvements made and residence maintained on Crown granted land.

Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20 acres, may be leased as homesteads; title to be obtained after fulfilling residential and improvement conditions. For grazing and industrial purposes, areas exceeding 640 acres may be leased by one person or company.

PRE-EMPTORS' FREE GRANTS ACT.

The scope of this Act is enlarged to include all persons joining and serving with His Majesty's Forces. The time within which the heirs or assigns of a deceased pre-emptor may apply for title under this Act is extended from one year from the death of such person, as formerly, until one year after the conclusion of the present war. This privilege is also made retroactive.

TOWNSITE PROPERTY ALLOTMENT ACT.

Provision is made for the grant to persons holding uncompleted Agreements to Purchase from the Crown of such proportion of the land, if divisible, as the payments already made will cover in proportion to the sale price of the whole parcel. Two or more persons holding such Agreements may group their interests and apply for a proportionate allotment jointly. If it is not considered advisable to divide the land covered by an application for a proportionate allotment, an allotment of land of equal value selected from available Crown lands in the locality may be made. These allotments are conditional upon payment of all taxes due the Crown or to any municipality. The rights of persons to whom the purchaser from the Crown has agreed to sell are also protected. The decision of the Minister of Lands in respect to the adjustment of a proportionate allotment is final. The time for making application for these allotments is limited to the 1st day of May, 1919. Any application made after this date will not be considered. These allotments apply to town lots and lands of the Crown sold at public auction.
