WIERD STORY FROM

Terrible Condition of Family Where Wife Was Insane; Hoisted Distress Signals.

An almost inconceivable story concerning the alleged terrible plight of Lighthousekeeper Sadler and his family at Entrance Island comes from Port Alice in a report sent out following the arrival of the Consolidated Whaling Company's steam whaler St. Lawrence on Quatsino Sound.

Capt. Oversen, master of the St. Lawrence, on his arrival at Port Alice reported having answered distress signals which had been flying at the Entrance Island lighthouse for five days.

He found the keeper of the lighthouse and his family in a very distressing state, but in spite of his trouble the lightkeeper heroically stuck to his post, and succeeded in keeping the light burning for the guidance of mariners navigating the treacherous and rock-bound waters of the West Coast of Vancouver Island.

Lost Her Reason.

The wife of the lightkeeper, it is reported, had become violently insane, and the husband was completely exhausted through restraining his wife from doing away with herself.

It is presumed that the continued isolation at the far-flung station on the stormy West Coast caused the lightkeeper's wife to lose her reason. Two of the four children were reported to be in a precarious state for want of food.

Capt. Oversen took aboard Mrs. Sadler and two of the children and landed them at Port Alice, where they are being taken care of. The lighthouse keeper is still tending the light, but is said to be in a critical condition.

Aid Is Sent.

Upon receiving the report from Port Alice, Capt. G. E. L. Robertson, agent of marine for British Columbia, at once made arrangements to dispatch an officer of the department to investigate the trouble at Entrance Island. For this purpose. Gordon Haikett, superintendent of lights, left for Port Alice by the steamship Princess Maquinna.

Officials of the Marine Department are unable to understand the report coming from the West Coast regarding the condition of Lightkeeper Sadler and his family.

By the United States Military Service Convention Regulations,

approved by the Governor-in-Council on 20th August, 1918, Male

Citizens of the United States in Canada, within the ages for the

time being specified by the Laws of the United States prescribing

compulsory military service, except those who have diplomatic ex-

emption, are made subject and liable to Military Service in Canada,

and become entitled to exemption or discharge therefrom, under the

Canadian Laws and Regulations. The regulations governing this

liability are published in the Canada Gazette (Extra) of 21st Aug.,

1918; copy whereof may be obtained upon application through the

post to the Director of the Military Service Branch of the Depart-

United States Citizens of the description aforesaid who were in

Canada on 30th July, 1918, have sixty days from that date within

which to exercise an option to enlist or enroll in the forces of the

United States, or to return to the United States; and those who for

any reason subsequently become liable to Military Service in Canada

have thirty days from the date of the accruing of such liability

within which to exercise the like option. It is stipulated by the

Convention also that certificates of diplomatic exemption may be

granted within the optional periods aforesaid. Every citizen of the

United States to whom the regulations apply is required to report

to the Registrar under the Military Service Act, 1917, for the prov-
