The greatest obstacle to the success of the Allies will be, in the first place, the shortest line to which the enemy may fall back, from the southermost point of the Dutch border passing in front of Liege, in front of Metz and down to their present line at Belfort. It is apparent that the shortening of the German line will give the defenders every opportunity to place men and guns along the whole front, without gaps, through which the Allies might outflank the Germans. 
