Wood, Toronto; R. T. Riley, Winnipeg; C. M. Hamilton, Weyburn, Sask.; A. J. Mitchell, and Major Bell, Deputy Minister of Railways. Mr. Hanna, Mr. Mitchell and Major Bell are already on the Board; the other five are additions. Hanna has a fairly free hand in operating the system on strictly business lines. The arrangement is said to be temporary, pending elaboration of a general railway nationalization scheme.
