At Skidegate.

Across the inlet after passing | processes across the inlet after passing | two sentinel islands the steamer calls at Skidegate Indian village. The Prince Rupert Oileries Company have a war, industry there, which produced refined fish oil for export. Messrs. Reil and Tisdale are in charge of the work, turning out hundreds of gallons of greyfish oil and preparing to place food fish in a cured condition on the market. The Skidegate Indians have a fine village at this point. Their houses are all modern with streets, water, works, chutches, a school house and, anchored in the bay, twenty useful gasoline launches, resplendent in paint, on which they are making a good living from the sea. They have a number o small gardens, producing vegetables and fruit. The Indians own a number of cattle and are considered the most prosperous in the province.

Oil Works.

The next stop was at the oil works where Ed. Stevens manages the hotel and where several old time residents live. We there learned of the Southeaster gold and silver mine, five miles distant on which twelve men are employed, with modern machinery installed, all under the direction of Mr. Holmes, a young mining engineer from Cobalt, who is producing ore in quantity, and expects to install an up-to-date plant. The company expended a large sum in proving the prop-

Queen Charlotte City. Queen Charlotte City was the

last place of call on the inlet before proceeding to the ports further south. The late D. R. Young was the founder of this locality. He installed a newspaper, commenced boring for coal and built a codfish warehouse. A large sawmill was installed, while town lots went booming. Things began to turn, in the wrong direction, and the once flourishing town received a set-back from which it is now recovering. Several of the original settlers, with a few of the business men, retained faith in Queen Charlotte City, and it seems that their convictions will be realized. The operations; lumber camps are springing up in the neighborhood, the location for a town is ideal, while the fishing industry bids fair to become a permanent means of employment for a large number of people.

Aliford Bay.

Aliford Bay, across the inlet from Skidegate, is the location of one of the largest canneries on the coast. It is said that Sir Thomas Lipton is the principal owner of this cannery, which was constructed by the late Sir Charles Doughty. Whites, Indians and Japanese to the number of 250 find employment at Aliford Bay, under the management of Mr. Sanderson, who has made a success of the business during two successive years, putting up phenominal packs of canned salmon. Several hundreds of barrels of herring have been prepared for shipment.
