CANADA'S HUGE EXPORT TRADE

This War Presperity Cannot Last -We Should be Conserving Surplus Savings Now.

The commercial prosperity of a country may be largely gauged by the calue of its export trade. Judged by that standard, Canada's present prosperity is literally astounding. In the year 1913, the ast year before the war, our total export trade amounted to \$377,016,355. For the fiscal year ending in March this year, it reached the amazing, almost staggering, figure of \$1,586,169,792.

In other words, the value of the goods sold by Canada to other countries is today more than four times what it was in the year beore the war. Nor is this the whole of the story. In the latter year the imports to Canada from other countries were of the value of \$670,089,066, while for the year ending last March they amounted

to \$962,521,847. Thus, while we are selling to other countries more than four times the goods we sold them five years ago, we are buying from them, though more, yet not half as much again as we then sold them. The result is that whereas in 1913 what we sold was less than half of what we bought, today the position is more than reversed, and what we buy is only, approximately, three-fifths of the amount we sell.

We have a balance of trade on the right side. From being debtors of others, we have become their creditors. But the transformation is owing to the war, and to that alone. It is up to each individual Canadian to make the most of the opportunity that offers by the exercise of thrift, thrift, and yet more thrift-thrift in every way-in order that our present favorable position may be rendered safe and secure against the uncertain days ahead.
