HAS MADE NEW MARK

Amelia Earhart's Flight from Continent in 24 Hours and 27 Minutes

NEWARK, N.J., July 26.—Mrs. Amelia Earhart's flight landed here at 11:28 yesterday morning from Los Angeles after establishing a woman's transcontinental record with elapsed time of 29 hours and 27 minutes, beating the time of Keith Nichols by almost ten hours but failing to exceed the mark of 28 hours, 23 minutes and 59 seconds held by Capt. Frank Hawks.

Mrs. Earhart had intended to make the flight non-stop but she made a forced landing at Columbus, Ohio, because of fuel feed trouble.

Mrs. Earhart declared that she would soon make another effort to lower the Hawks' record.

BRAMPTON, Ont., July 24.—In a real old wild west fashion, a band of cow boys and Indians swooped through here early today, stormed the Fair Grounds and, with cracking pistols, stampeded a group of 40 horses through the town and away.

He is in the Burns Lake Hospital, where he will probably be a patient for the next three or four weeks.

The funeral took place at Sunday afternoon from the United Church under the joint auspices of the Canadian Legion and the Elks' Lodge. Rev.
