Great interest is being manifested in the concert to be given soon in aid of St. Dunstan's Hostel for the Blind. Many tickets have already been sold, the proceeds of which are to be devoted to assist our blind soldiers and sailors.

None could listen unmoved to Corporal Nelson last Sunday afternoon in his address without a feeling of great thankfulness that there is such an organization as the Red Cross to look after the prisoners of war and to do all in their power to help them in their loneliness and suffering. To the management of the Westholme theater and to Mr. Werkhoven, who contributed their services, the thanks of the Society are extended.

Mrs. J. Gilmour and Mrs. Doby will have charge of the Red Cross sale in the "Hut" on Third avenue on Friday next.

The Seal Cove branch has sent another donation of \$100, which is acknowledged with thanks.

Last week an American handed in \$5 to Mrs. McDougall in the "Hut" and Mrs. Peters also received \$2, both of which amounts were placed with the funds of the Society the same day. The names of the donors were not given.

The Red Cross library in charge of Mrs. Backus and Mrs. Peters opened in the "Hut" last Friday. Many people listened attentively while its working was being explained. Already a great many people are availing themselves of the opportunity to secure beneficial reading and at the same time assist the Society in its endeavors. The library will be open on Tuesdays from 7:30 to 9:30 p. m. and on Fridays from 10 a. m. to 6 p. m.

For the library H. C. Black very kindly made and donated a card index case, also posters.

BRITISH LOAN

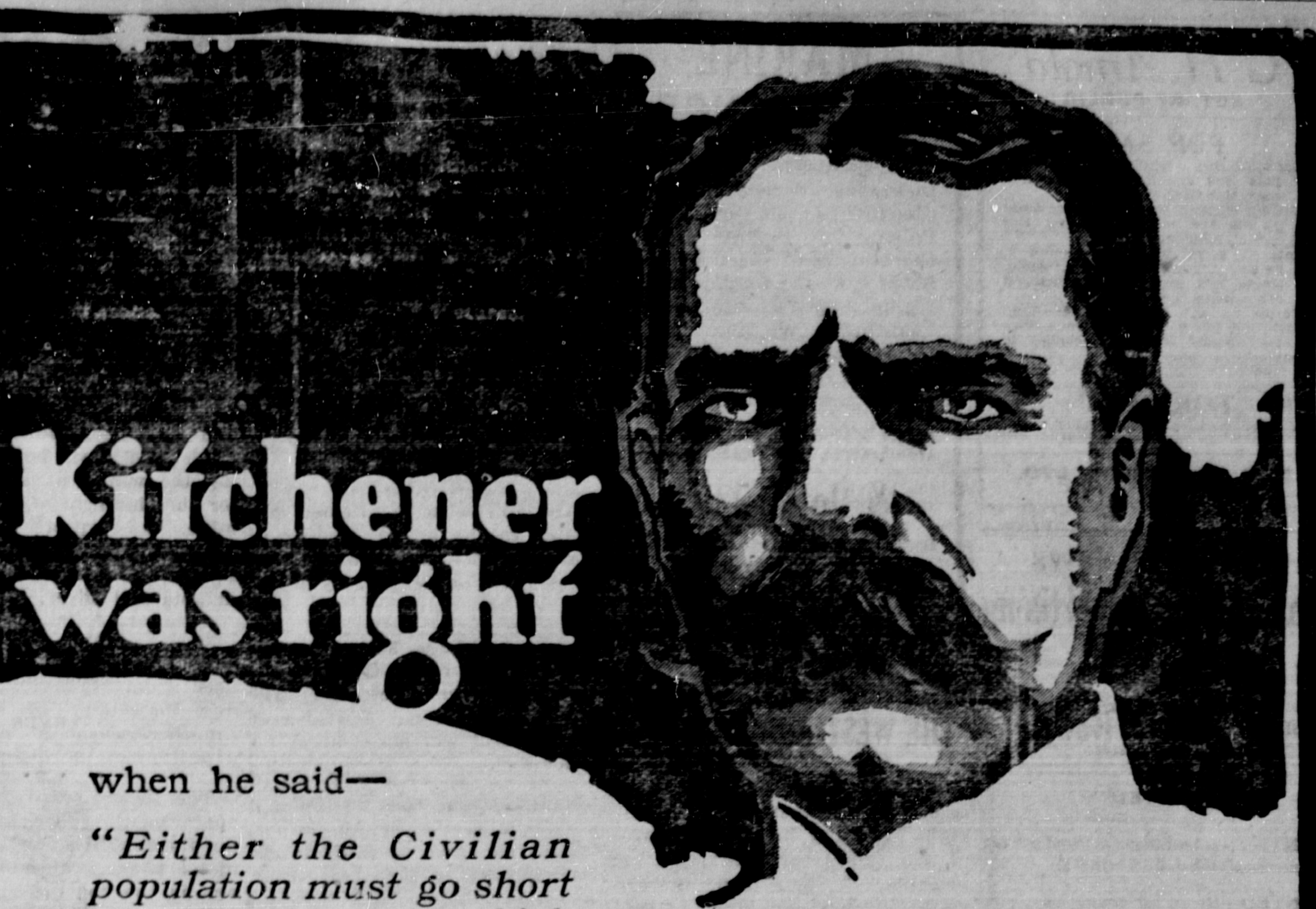
London, Oct. 2.—The campaign for the new British loan has been launched. It is expected there will be no trouble in raising a thousand million pounds.

"Either the Civilian population must go short of many things to which it is accustomed in times of peace or our armies must go short of munitions and other things indispensable to them."

NOW, the only way we can possibly live up to that obligation is by going without in order that our soldiers may have. For the money we waste is not money at all—it is equipment, clothing, shot and shell that are urgently needed in France.

By denying ourselves, therefore, we enable Canada to procure to the fullest extent the materials and labor which she and our Allies need for the successful prosecution of the war.

What happens when we fail to save?

A pull on labor by the Government in one direction and a pull on labor by the people

in the opposite direction. Hundreds of millions of dollars are of no use to the country if goods and services can be secured only to the extent of eighty millions of dollars. So we must do everything in our power to release both goods and labor for the purposes for which Canada needs them.

WHETHER it be food, coal, wool, steel, leather, labor or transportation, the result in all cases is the same. Whoever competes with the nation by freely satisfying his own desires, selfishly appropriates to his own use that which is so urgently required for our fighting men in France.

For the sake of your country and the boys "over there," spend cautiously. Think of what Lord Kitchener has said, and ask yourself first, "Is this something I really need or can I do without it?"
