

Tom Burns and Five Dogs Made Distance in 37 Days of Hiking

Bewhiskered and bedraggled after weeks of travel in the great silent wilderness of the sub-Arctic, Tom Burns, veteran prospector of three continents, blew into Dawson and is back to stay with the upper Yukon country, says the Dawson News. Burns traveled 560 miles over mountain, muskeg and tangled river bottoms and through dangerous streams in order to get back to Dawson. He came from Nenana, Alaska, the inland terminal of the new American government railway in Alaska.

The trip was made without a human companion, but with him Burns brought his five faithful companions of the trail, his native dog team.
