The jolly English musical comedy of the screen, "Sunshine Susie," is being featured on the screen of the Capitol Theatre here this week-end and it is a picture that is being highly and genuinely recommended. "Sunshine Susie," originally produced in Germany but re-cast and filmed in England, boasts good acting, excellent photography and clever sound effects.

Renate Muller, as Susie, the girl who not only finds a job but angles successfully for the director of the business, is a charming young woman. Owen Nares, matinee idol of the London stage, plays the part of the boss who succumbs to Susie's charms. Jack Hulbert and Morris Harvey furnish excellent comedy much of which is musical.

The picture contains some catchy tunes that are distinguished by clever presentation. One sequence shows a roomful of typists clicking out a tap dance rhythm in time to orchestral accompaniment. The picture is given a lot of style by effects such as this and other scenes when the music and action are synchronized. It is also very amusing. Summed up, "Sunshine Susie" may be described as unusually novel and entertaining and it is a real achievement for the British screen.

UNEMPLOYED IN SESSION

Provincial Relief Allowance Proposals Protested—Federal Persecution Claimed

The local branch of the National Unemployed Workers' Association, at a mass meeting last night with some 300 persons in attendance, endorsed the action of the Union of British Columbia Municipalities in protesting at the proposal of the government to reduce the unemployment relief allowance for married men with families to \$20 per month and that for single men to

\$10 per month. It was held that the relief allowances were already inadequate without thinking of further reductions.

It was declared at the meeting that the federal government, through the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, was persecuting active members of the National Unemployed Workers' Association. There was much discussion and condemnation from the platform of alleged autocracy of the federal authorities which it was declared was being practised all over Canada.

Reports from mining centres showed that still further reductions were being made in wages without corresponding reductions in living. Several members from the interior and the north were in atten-

dance at the meeting and spoke of conditions affecting them.

There was considerable discussion of Russia's new economic policy and the distribution of resources in that country.

Charles Chapman presided over the meeting.

With a light list of passengers, consisting principally of round trip tourists on board, C.P.R. steamer Princess Alice, Capt. William Palmer, arrived in port at 9 o'clock this morning from Vancouver and sailed a couple of hours later for Skagway and other Alaska points whence she is due to return here next Wednesday afternoon south-bound.
