The few | men that are drifting back now are a negligible quantity, comparatively. Soon, perhaps sooner than we expect, there will be large numbers pouring in on us and all have to be taken care of. Each one must be given a position equally as good as the one he left when he went to the war.

#### Coal is Needed, Says the Minister.

Hon Frank Carvell, when here, said that one of the necessary adjuncts to a great ocean port was plenty of steam coal. That is what must be obtained at Prince Rupert. Not only must there be coal in large quantities but at a price which will not handicap the vessels that come here to load.

According to common report there is plenty of good coal in the Telkwa district. One mine is about to become a shipper in a small way and there will be others undoubtedly which will follow. If there is not sufficient coal at Telkwa it will be necessary to look elsewhere. This is very important for this port and it is one that must be seriously considered soon.
