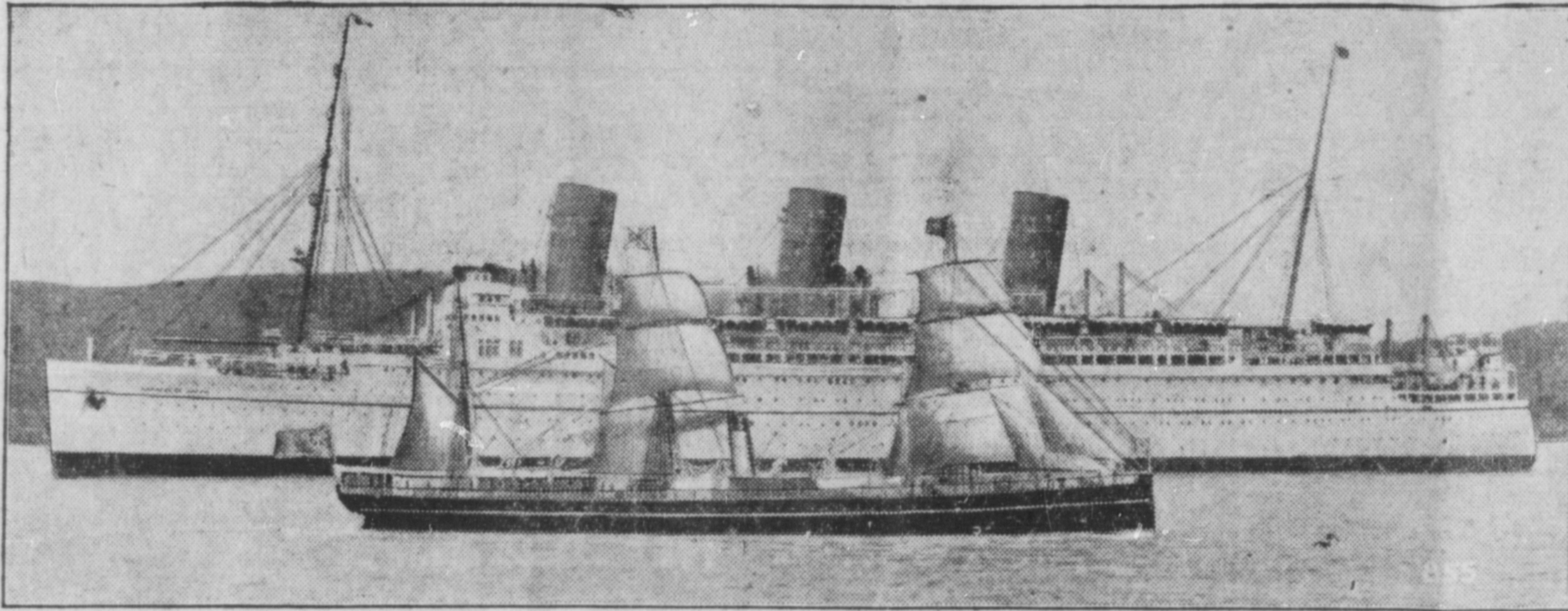


FORTY-FIVE YEARS OF PROGRESS

WATERFRONT WHIFFS Halibut Landings Mounting—Most of Fleet Busy—Yacht Helena B. Here

Halibut landings at the port of Prince Rupert for the 1932 season up to and including yesterday, totalled 7,305,150 pounds of which 2,336,750 pounds had been delivered by Canadian vessels and 4,968,400 pounds by American. During the week ending yesterday landings amounted to 396,500 pounds including 41,000 pounds from Canadian boats and 355,500 pounds from American.

According to a bulletin issued by the United States Bureau of Fisheries, landings of halibut by American vessels at Prince Rupert for the present season ending with May totalled 2,788,800 pounds, showing a slight increase over landings of American fish here in the corresponding period of last year which amounted to 2,733,000 pounds.
