## The Great Ideal Of a Great Man.

Abraham Lincoln once said: "Though I now sink out of view and shall be forgotten, I believe I have made some marks which will tell for the cause of civil liberty long after I am gone."

It is a great ideal, to make some marks that will tell in any good cause. It is probably the most any person can do. No man carries out any great reform alone. We often talk of a man having brought about some great change. His was perhaps the final influence that accomplished it. Without the co-operation |\* of others, however, the work of one man is not of much value. The man who can influence the people of his time to such an extent as to secure their co-operation in the accomplishment of a great reform is the great man.

There are in the world two kinds of men, those who do things and those who criticise the ones who do things. The former are the motive power and the latter are the breaks. Breaks are useful if applied at the right time, but to be the motive power is really to live. The greater the motive power the higher and better the life.

There is no such thing as goodness apart from action. To be merely negative is to be nobody, neither of use to God or man. The man who simply abstains from evil is empty and useless. Unless he has in him something of the life of the Creator he nonth. might as well not have lived. The whole of creation throbs with power, with action, with movement, with growth, with ceaseless urgings toward betterment. Eliminate these urgings and you have stagnation which breeds disease and death.

Even death itself is better than stagnation for death is the beginning of a new life.

### Rule of One Man Common as Ever.

There never was a time when the rule of strong men was needed as it is today. Socialists object to the use of the word "government" and would use instead the word "administration." It matters little what word is used, it is always one man who governs if the government is progressive and effective. For many years Lloyd George governed Great Britain. 
