SYNOPSIS OF LAND ACT AMENDMENT

Pre-emption now confined to surveyed lands only.
 Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes, and which is non-timber land.
 Particular pre-emptions abolished.
 Parties of not more than four may arrange for adjacent pre-emptions, with separate residences, but each making necessary improvements on respective claims.
 Pre-emptors must occupy claims for one year and make improvements of value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivation of at least 5 acres, before receiving Crown Grant.
 Where pre-emptor in occupation not less than 5 years, and has made proper improvements, he may, because of health or other cause, be granted immediate certificate of improvement and transfer his claim.
 Records without permanent residence improvements to extent of 1300 per annum and records same each year. Failure to make improvements as required are to be obtained on these claims in less than 5 years, with improvements of \$10 per acre, including 5 acres cleared and cultivated and residence of at least 1 year.
 Pre-emptor holding Crown Grant may record another pre-emption, if he requires land in conjunction with his farm, without actual occupation, provided statutory improvements made and evidence maintained on Crown granted land.
 Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 25 acres, may be leased as homesteads; title to be obtained after fulfilling residential and improvement conditions.
 For grazing and industrial purposes, areas exceeding 40 acres may be leased by one person or company.

PRE-EMPTORS' FREE GRANTS ACT.

The scope of this Act is enlarged to include all persons joining and serving with His Majesty's Forces. The time within which the heirs or devisees of a deceased pre-emptor may apply for title under this Act is extended from one year from the death of such person, as formerly, until one year after the conclusion of the present war. This privilege is also made retroactive.

TOWNSITE PROPERTY ALLOTMENT ACT.

Provision is made for the grant to persons holding uncompleted Agreements to Purchase from the Crown of such proportion of the land, if divisible, as the payments already made will cover in proportion to the sale price of the whole parcel. Two or more persons holding such Agreements may group their interests and apply for a proportionate allotment jointly. If it is not considered advisable to divide the land covered by an application for a proportionate allotment, an allotment of land of equal value selected from available Crown lands in the locality may be made. These allotments are conditional upon payment of all taxes due the Crown or to any municipality. The rights of persons to whom the purchaser from the Crown has agreed to sell are also protected. The decision of the Minister of Lands in respect to the adjustment of a proportionate allotment is final. The time for making application for these allotments is limited to the 1st day of May, 1919. Any application made after this date will not be considered. These allotments apply to new lots and lands of the Crown sold at public auction.

EXPRESS REGRET AT LOSS OF COLLEAGUE

City Council Passes Resolution of Condolence With Widow of Late Alderman Smith.

The City Council last night went on record as expressing regret at the death of their late colleague, Alderman Smith, and recorded their sympathy with the widow and family. The resolution was moved by Alderman Dybhavn and seconded by Alderman McMeekin, as follows:

"That the members of this Council deeply regret the death of one of its members, Robert J. D. Smith.

"The members of this council believe they express, not only their own feelings, but also the sentiment of all our citizens when they say that Mr. Smith's death is a very distinct loss to the whole city.

"The members of the Council tender to the family of the deceased their most sincere sympathy in the heavy loss with which they have been visited."

WILL PURCHASE BOAT

City Council at Meeting Last Night Passed Unanimous Resolution Favoring Action.

On the recommendation of Alderman Dybhavn, chairman of the Public Utilities Committee, the City Council last night decided in favor of purchasing a new boat for the use of the engineers working across the Shawatians narrows. The cost of the boat is to be \$75 and of the engine \$250. The engineers will install the engine and keep everything in repair. Also they will build a boat-house, the city to find the lumber. Alderman McEae showed how it would cost over \$400 a year to hire a boat and it would be a good bargain to purchase one.

NEW HAZELTON

The sale of Government lands on the townsite resulted in only one lot being taken. The reserve price on each lot was \$15 and the bidders would not go that high. W. S. Sargent was the only purchaser.

James G. Powell died on Wednesday last from influenza. He was an assayer, 29 years of age, an Englishman by birth and education. He leaves a wife to whom he was married less than a year ago and who was formerly Miss Ruby Sortwell of Vancouver.

The death occurred last week of Mark Hall, engineer at the Silver Standard mine and a returned soldier. His young wife and infant child recently arrived from England where Mr. and Mrs. Hall were married. The funeral took place on Wednesday.

A number of people who were ill with influenza are recovering, but there are still a number who are down with the dread malady.
