Fishermen Will Get Some Protection.

It is most satisfactory news which is received today to the effect that the small docks at Cow Bay are to be built at once to accommodate the fishing craft which ply out of this port. It is unsatisfactory however to know that the docks will not be more than a third the size that was intended, owing to the delay in effecting the transfer of the land from the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway to the Provincial Government.

The delay has been caused by the action of the City Council in intimating that they would oppose the transfer when it can. before the Board of Railway Commissioners. That the Council did this with a proper motive no one doubts, but that they were wrong seems also to be the general opinion. The matter has now come to a point where something should be done immediately to try to induce the Provincial Government to again change their plans and give us the full sized set of floats as originally intended. Whether they will do so or not remains to be seen.

Immediate Action Might Change Plans.

The News has no inside information in regard to this matter, but the assumption is that if the Council would agree to withdraw |* their opposition to the transfer of the property at Cow Bay, the Government might be induced to go on with the original scheme. The Railway Company undoubtedly needs the creek at Cow Bay filled in, in order to make it safe for the yard men to operate does its work about as cheap as there.
