Fishermen Will Get
Some Protection.

It is most satisfactory news which is received today to the effect that the small docks at Cow Bay are to be built at once to accommodate the fishing craft which ply out of this port. It is unsatisfactory however to know that the docks will not be more than a third the size that was intended, owing to the delay in effecting the transfer of the land from the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway to the Provincial Government.

The delay has been caused by the action of the City Council in intimating that they would oppose the transfer when it came before the Board of Railway Commissioners. That the Council did this with a proper motive no one doubts, but that they were wrong seems also to be the general opinion. The matter has now come to a point where something should be done immediately to try to induce the Provincial Government to again change their plans and give us the full sized set of floats as originally intended. Whether they will do so or not remains to be seen.

Immediate Action
Might Change Plans.

The News has no inside information in regard to this matter, but the assumption is that if the Council would agree to withdraw their opposition to the transfer of the property at Cow Bay, the Government might be induced to go on with the original scheme. The Railway Company undoubtedly needs the creek at Cow Bay filled in, in order to make it safe for the yard men to operate there. It is not so much in the interests of the company as of the workmen to whom the open creek is dangerous when shunting.

The 450 feet of waterfront which is to be acquired by the Province in exchange for the yardage is all to be used for the benefit of the fishermen of Prince Rupert. The city, while it will not own the property, will reap all the benefit from it. When later on they find that they need a piece of property for municipal purposes, such as landing gravel, they are promised that they will receive every consideration from the Government.

City is Not
Party to Deal.

The deal is not between the city and the Railway Company, but between the Provincial Government and the Railway Company, the city being consulted as a matter of courtesy. It is just possible that the city by opposing the deal before the Railway Commission could block it, but even that is doubtful. All that the Government asks is that the city shall refrain from taking any action.

When Mr. Pattullo was here in the summer he discussed the matter at some length with the City Council and he promised on behalf of the Provincial Government that, if opposition was withdrawn, the Public Works Department would undertake to commence work at once on the floats, even though the actual transfer had not been effected. In view of the promised opposition of the Council, however, they could not see their way clear to going ahead and building the floats on property which did not belong to them.

Fishermen Suffered;
City Lost Business.

The result of the delay has been that the fishermen have had to suffer and indirectly the merchants have lost business through many fishermen going to Seattle and Vancouver to winter when they would otherwise have remained here.

It is understood that the fishermen are now taking the matter up themselves and are preparing a petition to the Council which they will ask the merchants and others to sign, requesting the Council to withdraw their opposition to the scheme. The only question is whether or not the matter may be delayed to such an extent that it may be too late to secure the docks. If the port is to benefit by the scheme to the fullest possible extent, action should undoubtedly be taken at once and the Government asked to send instructions to go ahead with the complete scheme. That would accommodate all the boats which would be here for some time to come.
