CREW OF POLAR BEAR ARRIVE IN VICTORIA

Captain Hadley of Stefansson's Exploration Ship Arrives With Nine Men From Nome.

SHIP HAS BEEN BEACHED AWAITING MANY REPAIRS

The Polar Bear, Stefansson's exploration ship now at St. Michael, Alaska, will cost from \$5,000] to \$6,000 to repair; in order to remove the effects of damage sustained at Barter Island last

This is the statement of her aptain, J. R. Hadley, who with nine men has arrived in Victoria o report to the naval authorities !

Captain Hadley says it may be months before anything further is heard of Storker; Storkerson's party, which was reported in September to be pushing on moving ice into the unexplored section of the Beaufort Sea. He does not expect news until next spring, perhaps not until late in 1919. Lack of communication explains this expectation of delays, he!

An Experienced Man.

Captain Hadley, ice navigatorsince 1806, told some of his experiences in connection with the Canadian Arctic Expedition. Only three winters since he first made acquaintance with the frozen north has he spent outside, so that his experience of the latest expedition is nothing new.

The story of the winter of 1915-16 at Armstrong Point, Prince of Wales Strait, Victoria and, of the same season of 1916-17 at Walker Bay, and of operating as a supply ship durng the short open summer season is largely that of the Stefansson expedition already told.

Food Shortage. Captain Hadley explained an aspect which is often lost sight of in the record of these expeditions. "The supporting boat," he said, "has by no means an easy time so far as its occupants are concerned, for everything in the nature of food has to make way for the ice parties, so that the ship's crew is left with the changeless diet. There is the chance of getting fresh meat sometimes, but often that is impossible, and frequently fish is not easy to secure."

The bitter cold is very trying, the captain stated that at Walker Bay the thermometer registered sixty-five degrees below.


