Will Be Operated By Company in Co-Operation With Canada's National Railway System.

FOUR EIGHT-THOUSAND-TON STEAMERS TO START

Bringing with them the signed contracts for four steel vessels of 8,100 tons each, to be built at Victoria, Mr. Chas. V. Spratt, head of the Victoria Machinery Depot, and Mr. R. R. Neild, manager for the firm, have arrived back in Victoria after completing negotiations with the Dominion Government for the construction of steel ships here. Besides the actual contracts for four vessels the company has assurances of enough construction to keep the new yard going for some years, just as long as the Government programme continues. The new steel plate works at Sydney, N. S., which are now being built, have contracts to supply ships' plates to the Government for five years from the time they start work about next July, so that would insure at least five years' work on Government ships here.

A New Industry. The success of the Victoria Machinery Depot in securing these contracts means the inauguration of a new industry which is bound to be more permanent than that of wooden shipbuilding. The V. M. D. will build the hulls of the vessels, the engines and some of the other equipment, although the officials of the company are not ready to say just how extensively they will commence. The plant will cost an enormous sum and the payroll will be a large one. Two ways will be used.

It is not yet known how fast the boats can be turned out, and there is no time limit set. But as ships will be started as fast as the ways are cleared, it will pay the company to work at high

The steel for the new vessels will be got from Pittsburg at first but as soon as the new works at Sydney are ready the plates will come from there.

Used With Railway.

Speaking of the new steel vessels which will be built for the Government, Hon. C. C. Ballantyne, Minister of Marine, after expressing the view that the rates of freight prevailing would continue for some time after the war, said it was the intention of the Government to operate its vessels in connection with the Canadian National Railway System on the Atlantic, the Pacific, and The Great Lakes. There will, he said, "unquestionably be a very great demand for tonnage to carry products of the fiield, the mine, the forest and the factory, as well as to bring back the Canadian soldiers who have splendidly participated in bringing about the victory which now seems so near."

The Minister further authorized the statement that, on his recommendation, the Government had decided that the vessels to be constructed will be operated by a steamship company organized to work in co-operation with the |Canadian National Railway System, free in all respects from interference of any kind and under the management of Mr. D. H. Hanna and his board of directors. In the adoption of this policy, Mr. Ballantyne said: "The Government is following the system adopted and now in operation by Alice Arm in the Skeens Mining Division. the Canadian Pacific Railway."


