SEATTLE LABOR MEN TO STRIKE TO HELP MOONEY

Seattle, Wash., Nev. 21. With an unanimous vote the Seattle Central Labor Council voted to strike on December 9 unless prior to that time Thomas J. * Mooney, convicted of murder in connection with the San Francisco bomb explosion, has been granted new trial or given his freedom.

An immediate referendum vote on the strike resolution is asked of all labor unions affiliated with the Council.

London, Nov. 21 .- The Belgians, rapidly carrying out the reoccupation of their country, have advanced more than fifty miles from the lines held by them when the armistice was signed. They have entered Turnaout, 24 miles northeast and Hrenthals 18 miles east of Antwerp.
