It is also possible and even probable that before very long |* there will be more than one line of ships making this port its * headquarters on this side of the Pacific. A fast mail service between Vladivostok and London would make great time this way, and the silk shipments from Japan and China would reach the market by this route much quicker than by any other. Most of * the transpacific liners almost pass our doors for they go within sight of the Aleutian Islands.

Coal is naturally a difficult problem, but it must be remembered that the liners that used to call at Portland often came across to Comox to get their coal, and Comox is farther from Portland than it is from Prince Rupert.
