

SOLDIERS AND SAILORS IN NEW YORK BROKE UP MASS MEETING OF BOLSHEVIKI

CHARGED THROUGH CORDON OF POLICE AND ATTACKED CROWD WHO PACKED BUILDING IN MADISON SQUARE GARDEN LAST NIGHT

(Special to The News via G. T. P. Telegraphs.)

New York, Nov. 26.—Hundreds of soldiers and sailors broke through a cordon of police surrounding Madison Square Garden last night and attacked international agents, who addressed a mass meeting at which Bolsheviki doctrines were expounded. Men and women leaving the hall broke and fled as men in uniform charged the police, but were pursued into side streets in all directions.

The opening of the doors of the garden witnessed a wild scene. Soldiers and sailors fought their way past, swinging night sticks and attacked the Socialists who had packed the building.

Almost instantly the square was filled with yelling, running, fighting men.

Mounted police reinforced by automobile loads of reserves, rushed from every station house within a radius of miles, struggling valiantly to clear the square, but made little progress.

The parade will tart on a signal gun being fired by the Malaspina and will proceed at a five-knot speed, the larger vessels keeping 300 yards apart and the distance gradually diminishing with the smaller craft. All boats are expected to follow the lead.
