The Jap oranges are retailing at about 30c. a dozen or \$1.35 a box. New navel oranges are selling at from 75c to \$1.00, according to quality.

Cranberries are being used very extensively just now. They are selling at 25c. a pound. New figs. are on the market at 10c. and 25c. a pkt., and California grapefruit are going at 10c. each.

There is a slight stiffening in the price of meats, the inferior joints coming up slightly. Leg of mutton, however, can be bought! for 45c. a pound.


