

Ballantyne, Minister of Marine and Fisheries, the question of awarding to Prince Rupert some of the ships which the Dominion will construct and operate as a national marine, says the Victoria Colonist. Negotiations which had been under way for some time appear to have languished until the arrival of the minister at Ottawa, but after a conference with the Federal minister arrangements were completed whereby two large steel ships were awarded to the Mullen concern of the northern city and yesterday Hon. Mr. Pattullo received notification that the contracts have been let. The construction of the big 10,000-ton ships will mean much to Prince Rupert, which in the past has complained with apparent reason that in the letting of war contracts as well as other Federal work it has been sadly neglected.
