After pointing with pride to the fact that the Institute was one of a very few which had survived the trying period of the war, he dealt with the unprecedented experience of the life companies in the losses sustained through Spanish influenza.

"The death losses through the war," declared Mr. Crossin, "did not bring the companies' losses up to the expectancy under the mortality tables and I believe that the ratio of war losses this year is possibly not quite as heavy as last. With almost two months to go after the cessation of hostilities, a marked improvement in the loss ratio might have been expected had it not been for the epidemic referred to. The results of that epidemic are such that it is quite likely that an average of one hundred per cent. of the expectancy will be realized by the life companies as a whole this year and, if there should be a continuance of the spread of the "Flue," that expectancy may be exceeded.
