

## ELECTRICITY FOR INDIANS

People at Village of Lak Kaltzap on Naas River Get Modern Lighting System Installed.

### ELECTRIC LIGHTS FOR STREETS AND HOUSES

In order that the Indian population of the village of Lak Kaltzap, which lies some forty miles below Aiyansh on the Naas river, may have a sufficiency of illumination in their homes and on the village streets, D. R. Kennedy of the Prince Rupert Engineering and Supply Company, left town yesterday on his way to the village. He is going there to install one of the famous "Delco" lighting plants, for which his firm are agents.

The plant is similar to that used at the exhibition here in September. The Indian visitors when here then saw it at work, and decided that it was what they wanted. The system installed will carry some 200 lights, and will serve both the houses in the village and also the streets. The Indians in northern B. C. are nothing if not up to date, and this venture at Lak Kaltzap is expected to be followed by many of the other Indian villages in the district.

The Indians of this same village are contemplating erecting a sawmill for themselves, which may be a hydro-electric proposition also.

The first cost of this new system of village lighting to be installed at Lak Kaltzap will be over \$2,000, and the system itself is capable of expansion, if need be, to meet the growing necessities of the people there. Most of the work of installation is already completed, and all that remains to be done now is the final touches from Mr. Kennedy to enable the Indians there to see one another after dark.

table is a monorail track which extends the entire length of the sorters and terminates in a transfer bridge running across the entire plant and yard at right angles to the monorail tracks. Mounted on the bridge is 30 foot transfer crane with a monorail suspended beneath which comes into exact alignment with the stubends of the various monorails throughout the plant and enables the hoist to pass from one track to another via this transfer crane without releasing its load. This system gives access to any and all parts of the plant and storage with one hoist and without the employment of switches or curves.

Consistent efficiency was the chief aim of the designers of this plant and successful performance should be their reward. The unlimited supply of virgin spruce, the ample log storage and the excellent facilities for manufacturing, handling and shipping make it eminently possible for this mill to produce lumber at a minimum cost.
