MAKE PROVISION FOR RETURNED SOLDIERS

Victoria, Dec. 14.—With the possibility of a considerable amount of unemployment resulting as an aftermath of the war, and in view of the fact that some sixty to eighty returned men are being discharged within this Military District each day, Premier Oliver was asked as to what provision the Provincial Government had made in relation to employment on public works.

"Instructions have been given by the Provincial Government that in all provincial public works the preference in the matter of employment is to be given to returned soldiers and sailors, and in the second place to British Columbia citizens," was the Premier's prompt reply.

"And so that there shall be no doubt upon the matter every department affected has been duly and officially notified in this regard," said Mr. Oliver with emphasis.

PRINCE RUPERT GOES SOUTH ON SUNDAY

The steamer Prince Rupert stays on her regular run for the present until it comes time for her annual overhaul, when she will be temporarily laid up and some extensive improvements made to the interior. She leaves as usual for the south Sunday night.
