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TEMPORARY ROOM FOR SCHOOL PURPOSES ON SECOND AVENUE

A new school-room is to be opened at once in the Hays building on Second Avenue. At the meeting of the school board last night it was decided to take the room for a year at a rent of \$35 a month, to put in temporary furniture and get it ready for the pupils.

Principal Macdonald of the King Edward School reported having examined the room and found it fairly well suited for the purpose. It was well lighted and large enough, he thought, to accommodate about forty pupils. Heat is to be supplied from the furnace in the building and is included in the price to be paid. The walls are to be kalsomined and it is expected to be ready for use next week. The chief difficulty was the lack of playground.

Miss Tingley reported that there would be slightly over thirty pupils in the class at first.

GERMANS SEND MONEY FOR UNITED STATES

Coblitz, Jan. 9.—Ten million marks has been received here from Berlin recently by special train, this sum being the first payment by the German Government of 25,000,000 marks due in January for the expenses of the American army of occupation. The arrival of this shipment made a total of 64,000,000 marks which has been turned over to the American authorities.

LORD ROBERT CECIL IS IN FAVOR OF A LEAGUE OF NATIONS

Paris, January 9.—Lord Robert Cecil who has arrived here with the first section of the British peace delegation expressed the opinion that a definite organization of a league of nations is indispensable as a first step towards a conclusion of enduring peace and the satisfactory settlement of international problems which have arisen out of the war. He made it clear that his statements were personal views and did not attempt to give the views of the British Government.
