TWO TRUSTEES WILL OFFER SERVICES FOR ANOTHER TERM

L. W. Patmore and Mrs. Kirkpatrick Will be Candidates for School Board, But G. H. Munro Will Retire.

Two of the three retiring school trustees will offer their services once more to the city. They are L. W. Patmore and Mrs. Kirkpatrick. Both these trustees have served two years and have done valuable work. George H. Munro who is the third retiring trustee will not be a candidate this year as he finds that he cannot give the necessary time to the duties.

At the meeting of the board last night Dr. Kergin expressed the pleasure he had taken in working with the other members of the board and he hoped the retiring members would be re-elected. He felt that the work of the schools was most important.

SCHOOL GROUNDS ARE NOT YET IN SHAPE

Principal Macdonald Reported to School Board Last Night That Coating of Cinders Had Not Yet Arrived.

The playground at the King Edward school is not yet available for the children owing to the fact that there is a coating of cinders yet to be applied. The city teams are to haul the material and one day they started the work but the cart went through the road, and nothing has been done since. That was the gist of the report made to the school board by Principal Macdonald last night.

The principal further pointed out that on fine days the pupils of his school were anxious to play games during the recess. This they were unable to do at present on account of the condition of the grounds. With a covering of cinders there would be a good place for football and similar games.

COAL MINING IS ACTIVE IN ALBERTA

The Rocky Hard Coal Company who have large interests in what is known as the Alberta Coal Branch of the Grand Trunk Pacific, are actively operating on a hill of coal which extends 60 feet above the level of the railway tracks, coal being taken from a facing of about 400 feet. The field is located near Coalspur station, 47 miles south of Edson. The coal is of good quality and is being shipped as far east as Winnipeg. That steam shovels are being used in loading the coal directly from the coal beds into the cars, indicates its accessibility.

On the suggestion of Trustee Munro the press will be notified of all meetings of the board of school trustees in future. Chairman Dr. Kergin expressed appreciation of the help the press could give the board and welcomed the presence of reporters at the meeting.
