## FINAL RETURNS IN THE VICTORY BOND CAMPAIGN

District Takes \$574,450 Worth of Securities, While City Alone Subscribed \$412,050.

The final returns for the Victory Loan have now been made and they show that the district subscribed \$574,450 of which the city took \$412,050. The quota set for the district was \$209,000 and for the city \$150,000, so that it can readily be seen that the district and city did much better than was expected. Even some local people were very dubious of the success of the campaign.

It is interesting to note that for Prince Rupert District there were 1619 applications while for the city 1168 people took bonds. Setting the population of the city at 5,000 it is easy to see what good work was for ever one in five to buy bonds.

## ALASKA SALMON PRICES REMOVED

All regulations in regard to the price of salmon in Alaska are removed.

This removal of all salmon prices in Alaska does not affect the matter of licenses for canneries, fishermen, etc.—such regulations being still in force and effect.

Following the lifting of the United States Food Administration regulations concerning the prices of fresh salmon in Washington and Oregon, the Federal Food Administrator for Alaska recommended to the United States Food Administration that all restrictions and regulations as to prices for salmon in Alaska be removed; the Food Administrator approved this recommendation.

### SMALL SAVINGS DESIRED

Despise not the day of small things—is advice the soundness of which has always been recognized. In national finance this holds as true as in other departments of life. So one sees the nations generally making it easy for their people to save, because it is realized that by the savings of the masses the national financial edifice may be made secure.

The Dominion Government has launched a War Savings plan that is framed to promote saving among all classes of Canadians. By this method money may be lent to the Government through the purchase of a War Savings Stamp at a cost of \$4.00, for which \$5.00 will be repaid by the Government in January, 1924.

This means that he money thus invested draws a little over 4 1/2 per cent compounded half-yearly. As behind these stamps stands all Canada, one can readily see that the security is unquestioned.

If Canadians do not become a saving people it will not be through lack of opportunity, or inducement, to save.
